Studio Arts Boulder provides a sense of belonging and connectedness against a backdrop of stressors such as social isolation and climate change. 

## To whom it may concern:

Studio Arts Boulder is an amazing organization and community partner and we are very excited to hear about their potential new community center, which we know will give our communities access to amazing art programs. We have worked closely with Studio Arts Boulder the past several years to provide free pottery sessions to our LGBTQ+ youth groups.

We first began our journey of collaboration with Studio Arts Boulder for our annual LGBTQ+ Youth of Color Leadership Retreat. This retreat consisted of three days of identity, community building, and advocacy workshops for LGBTQ+ Youth of Color ages 13-18. The goal of the leadership retreat is to offer a space for LGBTQ+ youth of color to explore and celebrate all facets of their identity. LGBTQ+ people of color face unique challenges due to the racism we experience in the predominantly white LGBTQ+ spaces and with homophobia and transphobia present in our communities of color. One of the workshops for our leadership retreat was led by Studio Arts Boulder. The theme we focused on was self-care and "filling your cup". Studio Arts Boulder provided a facilitator who identified within the LGBTQ+ community and all the materials and supplies. Our youth were taught how to hand build mugs, cups, or bowls. Our youth had an amazing time, some of whom had never engaged with pottery before.

Since then, Studio Arts Boulder has come into our weekly LGBTQ+ youth support groups to offer several free pottery sessions. Our weekly support groups see between 20-30 youth per week who identify as LGBTQ+ and are between the ages of 11-18. Studio Arts Boulder has provided these youth with a fun and welcoming opportunity into an art medium that is typically expensive and sometimes homogeneous in the identities of the participants. In this way, Studio



Arts Boulder is aware of the unique challenges and access issues for marginalized communities, and works to do outreach to bridge these gaps. As we know from data, LGBTQ+ communities, especially youth, are four times more likely to attempt suicide than their peers. Data also shows that the arts provide protective factors for people's mental health. I believe that giving access to several art mediums at the new community center, including pottery, black smithing, printmaking, etc. would have a positive effect on individual community members' mental health, but also in our collective community health, especially after our county has seen an incredibly difficult few years. I also believe that the new community center for Studio Arts Boulder would enable them to expand their impressive outreach and help bridge the gap even more for our marginalized communities.
